## **UAC Council Member Sharon Schimke**

Rick Hess of Puget Sound Clean Air (206.689.4029, [rickh@psccleanair.org](mailto:rickh@psccleanair.org) ) visited Maple Hills checking for Odor coming from the **Cedar Groves Compost**. On this occasion, the odor was unusually bad and resulted in a fine being levied on CGC.. Rick gave Sharon the following advice on reporting Odors that come from the Cedar Groves Compost Facility.

- Only address the odor you are currently experiencing (do not include historical information)
- Describe how the odor smells to you
- Describe how the odor affects your health
- Describe how the odor impacts your quality of life.

Sharon wants to add that those folks that are adversely impacted must be persistent and continue to report odor problems so Cedar Groves Compost can learn and correct the process that is causing the problem with its neighbors.

## **4Creeks Election**

- The proposed 4 Creeks Ballot was reviewed. The Election team proposed including a survey with the ballot mailing; however the council felt that there was not enough time to develop a survey strategy and a plan on how the council would use the information collected.
- The council voted on a proposal to publish a report out on the findings of the 2007 Survey and close that action item out and then decide on what type of information the council wants to include in the next survey and develop a plan to manage the survey process.
- Four Creeks Ballots, the content and format was approved
- The final ballots will be submitted to the printer by October 11, 2009 and the printer will have the ballots delivered to the post office by October 20,2009.
