Public Comment:

Capt. Thomas Commented that his main task was working on drug issues. Tom C. asked what the Sheriff Dept. can contribute to the organization of Block Watch in communities. Tom C. and Capt. Thomas will coordinate on block watch organization and publication of crime reports. The captain discussed a number of subjects, including how to respond to a suspected drug house – call 911, or call him. He also offered suggestion on making a home more secure – reinforcing doors at the hinges.

Mr. Sit discussed property assessment schedules, and mentioned that only about 10% declined in value in the 4 Creeks region. Discussion also summarized senior/disabled exemptions for property taxes.

Unfinished Business:

Transportation Planning:

- 1. Tom C.** talked about the “Transportation 2040” plan by the Puget Sound Regional Council. The plan is being updated using 2010 census data.
2. A question was raised whether our Vision and Mission Statement need review/revision.
3. We should submit recommended agenda items for discussion for the spring Community Service Area meeting (think roads).
4. Tom.C is applying for a 4-Culture grant. He talked about the application process, and suggested (from discussion with 4 Culture) that partnering with civic organizations may be helpful . He suggested a Heritage Analysis of the May Valley and Sunset Valley Farms
5. A coordinated effort with the Issaquah Historical Society might benefit the MCA 4-Culture grant application to document the communities 50-year history.

Minutes of the Jan 15th meeting were presented. A motion to approve was moved, seconded and passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.
