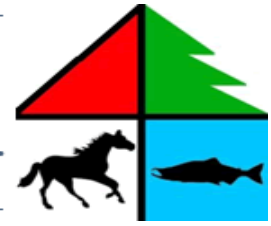

Peter Eberle called the meeting to order.

Guests present- Gwen High and Debi Eberle, CARE organization; Alan Painter, King County CSA Program; Wesley Chin, Supervising Engineer for stormwater systems and Rosanna Snyder of CPG in King County Parks.

Public Comment: none

Program: Discussion of work items in FCUAC/CARE and King County Memorandum of Understanding

Tom Carpenter began with a status update of the items on the FCUAC list of items hoped to be accomplished, including mapping various aspects of the tributary and the MOU area, failure to receive a grant in support of certain items which will be re-submitted for funding with the next cycle, work with GRCC students and future intended use and support of students in natural resource evaluation and mapping.

Gwen High, president of CARE (Community Alliance to Reach Out and Engage) cited progress in the Coalfield Park area with fencing of sensitive areas (plant and creek protection), maps and postings in the kiosk as well as successful/on-going discussions with the neighboring communities regarding trails. When citing the problems with illegal dumping of dirt into the Cemetery Bog area, a useful exchange of information developed between King County and CARE on joint interests. Explanations of efforts on bog maintenance and encroachment were respectfully presented. Notification of the May Creek Trib 291A stormwater retrofit project (Claire Jonson's) for water retention/filtering. This may be a likely presentation for the CARE meeting in January to hear of progress. KC representatives took notes, answered questions and provided information that all found helpful regarding activities they were engaging in to support the MOU.

An item on the list of work related to Signage was indicated as remaining "aspirational" for 2015 or 2016 since technology/hopes for long-term survival remain as challenges (graffiti and vandalism).

Other business:

Minutes of the October meeting were presented. Edie moved and Alyssa seconded approval. Minutes were approved with one abstention (Vern), and with one spelling correction.
