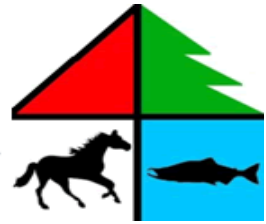

Peter Eberle called the meeting to order at 7 p.m..

Guests present: Seventeen including Debi Eberle, CARE organization. Marissa Alegria, King County CSA program.

Program: *Effect of Traffic Change in Issaquah for Trucks on May Valley Road* - Rick Brater, Traffic Engineer/Manager, King County Roads (DOT).

Some points noted: From August to November counts, it appeared truck traffic increased one-half of one percent. (inquiry of whether school buses were excluded, but counter can't distinguish.) General traffic (not trucks) August = 5172, November = 5183. Yes, older traffic could be looked at but is not Yet available on the website of KC.(Vern R. requested it be made available). Mr. Brater said "yes, we will do a speed study of the May Valley Road as it has been an issue raised by many, with speeding trucks being the issue brought forward, as well as apparent volume increases. Mr. Brater explained that 50-60% of all traffic is on Tier 1 & 2 unincorporated area roads, and also noted that more paving will occur on Tier 3 Roads as a result of recent budget increases. (See KC website for info on this topic of road Tiers.)

Winterbrook Farm; potential sale and local impact: Local resident Valerie Moore, Sunset Valley Farms, near the subject property pointed out several issues she and other neighbors are tracking and investigating relative to the negative impact to elk, trail access, salmon bearing streams' impact from development and the assertion that the roads in the area are not up to snuff for traffic impacts, let alone proposed development of the 80 acre parcel. A 1992 Seattle Times article was cited that said of it there "never should be any development."

Public Comment: Much during both presentations, but no new topics needed to be added to the agenda. No administrative reports were presented. December meeting was cancelled due to closeness of the holidays.

Meeting adjourned about 9:10 p.m.
