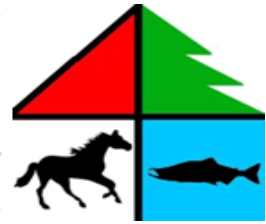

Speakers and some of the guests present:

Chris Hoffer, Tilth Alliance; Ashley Mihle from the King County Loop Biosolids program; Erin Auzins, Principal Legislative Analyst-KC Council staff; Marissa Alegria, KC CSA

Program: Interesting and fact filled presentations were given on Loop Biosolids by Ashley Mihle from the King County Loop Biosolids program. She talked about landscaping and gardening using soil amendments, various composts composition and availability, wise use of water in the home and garden compliments of King County in association with the Tilth Alliance. Chris Hoffer from Tilth Alliance offered tips for water-efficient and cost-effective measures inside your home. Lots of useful info and handy little devices were made available to those present so they can monitor and work towards wise use of the diminishing amount of water available.

Erin Auzins, Principal Legislative Analyst-KC Council staff talked about proposed **Farm Initiative** legislation. She spoke about the potential changes to the Agriculture regulations and designations, in order for community members to provide input/comments. Of special interest to some was the Public Review Draft on the subject of Breweries, Wineries and Distilleries. Others were interested in definitions of various designations and lots sizes for different activities. The eventual Executive proposals are expected to be taken up by the Council in October.
