

Minutes of the September 18, 2002 Regular Meeting of the Four Creeks U.A.C.

The meeting convened at 7:00 PM. Oscar Bandelin, David Rockabrand, Tom Tregoning, Tom Fisher, Denise Lockner-Jones, Cynthia Green, Marshall Brenden, Rick Spence, Gwendolyn High, and Rod McFarland were in attendance. Also in attendance were members of the public and a representative from David Iron's office.

David Bollinger of Energy Management gave a presentation of the 25M project his company has contracted with King County for to build a Gas to Energy facility at Cedar Hills Landfill. A motion was entertained, seconded, and passed to invite David Bollinger back to present more information to the Council at a later date.

Discussion of the upcoming joint UAC forum was heard. Suggestions included presenting items from the survey last year. Discussion was entertained questioning the validity of the survey from last year, the response rate, the random sampling. Other issues suggested to focus on included growth and traffic, growth/development, zoning, crime, Sheriff and Fire, schools issues. An action meeting on schools was suggested. The Issaquah teacher's strike was discussed. Oscar Bandelin solicited e-mails from Council members to further the suggestions of topics for the UAC Forum meeting.

Marissa announced the Forum had been changed from the 24th to the 30th, to be held from 7-9 p.m. at the Woodinville Library.

Marshall Brenden suggested following up on the 'Lets get the word out' campaign to advertise the UAC and meetings. Suggestions were: continuing to advertise, on a regular basis in the local newspapers, sandwich boards, possibly a booth at Salmon Days. Denise Lockner-Jones offered to contact Stacy Goodwin at the Issaquah Newspapers about a press release.

Claudia Donnelly was asked if she would like to submit a bio for another open position on the Council. She relayed that she wanted to wait until after the upcoming elections. Voting re-districting was briefly discussed. Public comment was then heard pertaining to appointed temporary at-large Council members, in reference to not having more than one member from each district in an appointed seat. Given the clarifications of the Bylaws, Rick Spence offered to resign his position, in accordance with the Four Creeks UAC Bylaws. Oscar Bandelin announced that Chuck Pillon had also resigned.

The meeting adjourned at 9:12 p.m.
