

Minutes of the October 02, 2002 Special Meeting of the Four Creeks U.A.C.

The meeting convened at 7:10 PM. Marshall Brenden, Cynthia Green, Rod McFarland, Tom Fisher, Tom Tregoning, Denise Lockner-Jones, Gwendolyn High, and Tami Harris were present. Marshall Brenden presided. Oscar Bandelin arrived at 7:15 p.m.

Gwendolyn High submitted a draft proposal to amend the Bylaws to reflect accurately the changes in re-districting. Noted was the fact that the Bylaws have apparently been out of date prior to this year. Changes include: Briarwood is gone, Hazen is gone, Tibbets creek is gone. Recommended was Ida in with District 2, and Briar be moved to District 5. Tom Tregoning also suggested that Brigid be moved to District 2, given the Registered Voter counts. Gwendolyn High will be revamping her proposal and will present it for a vote at the next regular meeting.

Rod McFarland presented a draft proposal to amend the Bylaws to clarify the terms of Council members. Discussion about the member at large positions ensued. Rod McFarland will review and add language to his proposal to clarify the member at large terms, and will submit it at the next regular meeting.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to set December 17, 2002 as the Election date, and use mail-in ballots.

Marshall Brenden suggested a community outreach potluck to introduce candidates, which was discussed.

A recap of the UAC Forum was given. UAC's presented charts, gave speeches, all contributed. One similar theme was the feeling that UAC's don't have adequate representation. DDES questions were heard. An audit of them is currently taking place. Oscar Bandelin was given positive feed-back on the Traffic and West Nile issue efforts of the Four Creeks UAC.

Marshall Brenden turned the meeting over to Oscar Bandelin at 7:40 p.m. Tami Harris left the meeting. Cynthia Green took over the reporting of the minutes.

Concerns for education of all children. Oscar solicited public and Council view on Issaquah School district. Claudia Donnelly gave information on impact fees that go to school district. \$2700 collected by City of Renton for Issaquah schools for homes in Renton city but in Issaquah School district. Rest of Issaquah collects \$4700 for new houses impact fees.
